

Multiply

Multiply is a 3 year programme funded through the Department for Education aimed at supporting adults to increase their skills in numeracy. Those who improve their numeracy skills are more likely to be in employment, have higher wages and better wellbeing.

Our free numeracy courses are for individuals:

- resident in North or West Northamptonshire, aged 19 and over
- that have not achieved a maths GCSE of at least a Grade C or equivalent
- who may want to develop numeracy skills for work or progression
- that want to brush up and develop their numeracy skills for everyday life.

Course aim

To develop learners understanding of how spreadsheets can support with managing and working with budgets. The course will explore the maths involved in creating formulas including recognising and understanding symbols and how maths operations are linked to formulas in Spreadsheets. Learners will then apply these skills in context.

Course outcomes

To recognise and use symbols and vocabulary linked to each of the four operations in both a mathematical and digital context.

To accurately solve calculating involving the four operations on a calculator and apply this understanding to create functions in spreadsheets.

To identify the language associated with averages in Maths, especially the mean, and accurately calculate the mean

Apply understanding of the mean to create and understand the 'AVERAGE' function within spreadsheets. To apply understanding of formulas in spreadsheets to create a simple budgeting tool.

How will the course be taught?

Face to face.

You may like to bring a pen/pencil and writing paper/pad to record your own notes if you wanted to. All other resources needed for the session will be provided
