Course aim

This course is ideal if you are looking to gain a qualification through a flexible self -study approach. You can start the course anytime throughout the year and can be completed within 12 weeks. The course is delivered through our online platform, where you will be given the relevant learning materials and assessments for this qualification.

This qualification is designed to increase your awareness and understanding of behaviour that challenges and its effects. By completing the qualification, you will develop in -depth knowledge of behaviour that challenges which could support progression onto other appropriate qualifications and into relevant employment in the health and social care sector.

This qualification would be valuable to those already working in education and health and social care settings.

Course Outcomes

You will complete 4 mandatory units as a part of this course:

Unit 1- Understand behaviour that challenges Knowledge

Unit 2- Understand how to support positive behaviour Knowledge

Unit 3 - Understand the importance of effective communication and the management of behaviour that challenges

Unit 4- Understand the role of reflection and support for those involved in incidents of behaviour that challenges

By the end of the course you will be able to:

- Understand the reasons why people present with behaviour that is perceived as challenging
- Understand the impact of behaviour that challenges
- Understand how to identify when an individual's behaviour may escalate
- Understand how the rights of individuals are protected
- Understand the role of others in supporting individuals who exhibit behaviour that is perceived as challenging
- Understand the benefits of reflection following episodes of behaviour that challenges
- Understand the support available to maintain own wellbeing.

How will the course be taught?

The course is online, you will receive a login to our learning platform where you will find the interactive learning materials and the assessments. You will be given deadlines to complete and submit the work. You will receive detailed feedback on your work so that you can improve your skills as you progress through the qualification.

You will be assigned a Tutor, who will be in touch throughout the 12 weeks to discuss your progress and support you through the course.

You will need to put some time aside each week to complete the course within 12 weeks.


Could I gain a certificate?

Entry Requirements: You should be 19+ by 31.08 in the academic year you wish to study This course requires a grade D/3 in English GCSE or equivalent (Functional skills: level 1)

Please note: You will be required to complete an online initial assessment to join this course.

Admissions Process: After you register your interest a member of our team will contact you to arrange the next steps.

General Information: In the unlikely event that you are unable to complete the course and need to withdraw there is a withdrawal fee of £100.

Eligibility: If you are in receipt of Jobseekers allowance, ESA or any other means -tested UK benefit (and your income excluding benefits is less than £617 per month or £988 per month for joint benefit claim), or you are employed and earning less than £20,319 per year you will be eligible to attend this course for the free. Even if you don't meet these criteria, you may still be eligible for learner support which could cover the cost of the course fees. Eligibility is subject to providing evidence.
