Course aim

The aim of this course is to improve the 4 skills of learning French at an intermediate level while studying and reinforcing grammar topics and, enabling you to develop an ability to communicate effectively. Pair work and group discussions using the textbook and other materials provided by the teacher. In class, learners will work, learn and speak together.

Course outcomes

- Improve fluency through regular practice and speaking drills at an intermediate level
- Expand vocabulary such in topics such as our lives, work and holidays through homework, exercises, and class work
- Develop a solid understanding of basic grammar structures and consolidate grammar points such as present, past and future verbs
- Practice natural flow of speaking and listening, to open and keep conversations going..

How will the course be taught?

A communicative approach is used. All four skills (speaking, reading, listening, and writing) are practised with the main emphasis on speaking. Learners engage in interactive language activities, participating in group and pair work. Learners will also be offered guidance in self-study and set optional homework tasks.
