Course aim

This course focuses on how a group of painters played their part in the development of art. We will explore how the group known as The Impressionists are placed on context in art history and will look at work produced by the cohort including: Monet, Manet and Renoir and how later artists such as Van Gough extended and pushed boundaries. We will discover some of the factors that this group of painters encountered and its possible causes and effects.

Course Outcomes

- 1) Demonstrate a knowledge of the variance of artwork relating to the Impressionist movement of the 19th century.
- 2) Recognise the changes to the development of art during this period in relation to the Enlightenment and Romantics.
- 3) Identify the relationship between art movements during this period in art history.
- 4) Evaluate the difference between the French Impressionists, Post-Impressionists and other Impressionist movements

How will the course be taught?

The course will be taught online via Zoom and will be a live interactive class.
