

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Entry requirements

Entry requirements:

This course requires a grade D/3 in English GCSE or equivalent (Functional skills: level 1) Please note: You will be required to complete an online initial assessment to join this course.

Eligibility:

If you are in receipt of jobseekers allowance, employment support allowance, or any other means -tested UK benefit (and your income excluding benefits is less than £617 per month or £988 per month for a joint benefit claim), or you are employed and earning less than £20,319 per year you will be eligible to attend this course for free. Even if you do not meet these criteria, you may still be eligible for learner support which could cover the cost of the course fees. Eligibility is subject to providing evidence.
