Personal Development

Personal Development courses can help you to take up a new interest, learn for enjoyment, build your confidence or gain skills for future employment or self-employment.

Course aims

Make floral designs with the use of inspiring materials around you. Often using just foliage, Cornus/Willow or similar, and string to conform your mechanics, enabling you to make a range of different floral creations. Collecting materials from your garden, hedgerow, park, or spinney. Flowers optional.

Course Outcomes

- Understand the elements of design to enhance your creations.
- Create a variety of different vase designs, exploring different methods to achieve this.
- Demonstrate leaf manipulation techniques.
- Make a tied posy.
- Create a table garland.
- Understand how participating in learning can increase personal confidence and a sense of wellbeing.

How will the course be taught?

The course will be taught online via Zoom and will be a live interactive class. Joining instructions along with unique log in for the session will be emailed to you by our support services team prior to the course start date so please check your email address prior to the class.

What do I need to bring / have ready?

To take part in the course, you will need a computer, laptop, phone or tablet connected to the internet and be able to view a live video stream. We also recommend that you have a pen and notepad to hand during the sessions.

For the first session bring a vase, some bushy foliage to act as the support for the arrangement. Three to five different types of contrasting foliage, pods, and twigs – considering their colours and visual texture; at least five stems of each.

Strong scissors / secateurs.
