

Multiply

Multiply is a 3 year programme funded through the Department for Education aimed at supporting adults to increase their skills in numeracy. Those who improve their numeracy skills are more likely to be in employment, have higher wages and better wellbeing.

Our free numeracy courses are for individuals:

- resident in North or West Northamptonshire, aged 19 and over
- that have not achieved a maths GCSE of at least a Grade C or equivalent
- who may want to develop numeracy skills for work or progression
- that want to brush up and develop their numeracy skills for everyday life.

Course aim

In a tutor led environment the course will give learners the confidence to begin sewing simple garments. During the 10 week duration of the course, learners will be encouraged to develop the knowledge of the various techniques they will need to master to have successful outcomes in any dressmaking projects. These techniques will iclude the starting point of taking accurate personal measurements, buying the correct commercial pattern through to all the sewing techniques essential to the construction of the garment.

Course outcomes

- a) Recognise the importance of taking the correct personal measurements.
- b) Use a commercial pattern with confidence and understanding.
- c) Produce samples of the techniques learned to aid future dressmaking projects.
- d) Identify different techniques including marking, pressing, cutting, sewing and fitting.
- e) Create a garment applying all the stages and techniques acquired.
- f) Apply a variety of Mathematical skills to be able to accurately complete the above objectives including, measures, fractions, understanding of shapes and converting units of measure.

How will the course be taught?

In a face to face tutor led environment. Demonstrations, 1:1, handouts, practical work, product samples and a weekly email.

Could I gain a certificate?

No qualifications/certificates are available in the course.

What do I need to bring / have ready?

Own sewing kit.

Own sewing machine.


Note book/folder/pens/pencils/rubber.
