Multiply

Multiply is a 3 year programme funded through the Department for Education aimed at supporting adults to increase their skills in numeracy. Those who improve their numeracy skills are more likely to be in employment, have higher wages and better wellbeing.

Our free numeracy courses are for individuals:

- resident in North and West Northamptonshire, aged 19 and over
- that have not achieved a maths GCSE of at least a Grade C or equivalent
- who may want to develop numeracy skills for work or progression
- that want to brush up and develop their numeracy skills for everyday life.

Course aim

The purpose of this course is to develop your knowledge and understanding of Mathematical concepts and prepare you for your next step towards enrolling on a Functional Skills course working at the Entry Levels. You will continue to develop the language needed to be able to successfully access the Maths Functional Skills curriculum whilst also beginning to develop your knowledge of skills in Maths areas such as: place value. addition, subtraction, division and multiplication, fractions, decimals, measures, shapes and data handling.

Course outcomes

To develop knowledge of language and apply efficient written methods for each of the four operations.

To name and describe the properties of 2D and 3D shapes using accurate language.

To recall the language, tools and units of measures required when working with Length, Time, Weight and Capacity.

To accurately create a variety of charts, graphs and tables and interpret the information provided from them using the correct language.

How will the course be taught?

This course will be delivered face to face.

You may choose to bring a dictionary to support with any translations you may need. You may also like to bring a notepad and pen/pencil to record any notes that you would like to make to support you with your learning.


