Course Description

To help parents and carers manage difficult behaviour.

Course Outcomes

- a) To find out how to manage your child's behaviour. (SLlr/E3.1- Listen for and follow the gist of explanations, instructions and narratives in different contexts)
- b) To find out how to develop good relationships with your child. (SLd/E3.1- Follow and understand the main points of discussion on different topics)
- c) To find out ways of encouraging your child to behave in a positive way. (SLc/E3.4- Make requests and ask questions to obtain information in familiar and unfamiliar contexts)
- d) To gain new skills, knowledge and confidence in a positive learning environment.

How will the course be taught?

The course will be taught with lots of practical elements including group and paired work.

Could I gain a certificate?

You will gain an Adult Learning Service certificate for attending the course. If you are working towards a recognised qualification and you are successful then you will gain a certificate from the relevant awarding organisation.
